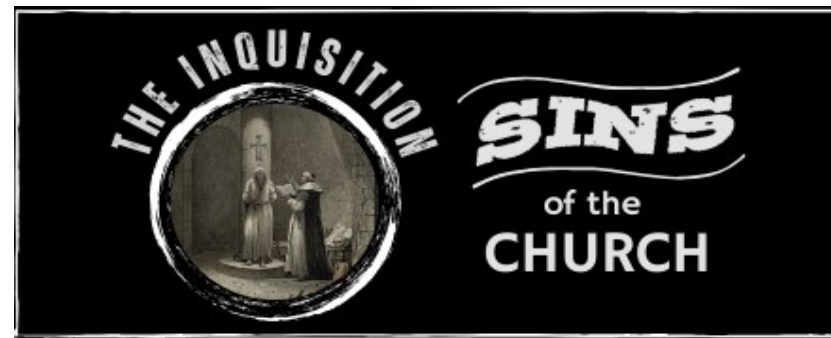
Lenten Judas Purse
